





























































































































































































































































































































































































**13. c.** The original sentence has a punctuation error—plural numbers such as 20s and 30s do not use an apostrophe. Choice **e** corrects that error, but exchanges the word *expatriate* (a noun or adjective meaning “voluntarily living in another country”) for *expatriot* (which is not a word in standard English). Choice **b** includes both errors, while choice **d** introduces a new one—*and who included* is incorrect. There is no need for a coordinating conjunction.

**14. b.** Compare choice **a** to choice **b**, noting how careful editing creates a clear and concise sentence out of a wordy, awkward one. Choices **c**, **d**, and **e** don’t contain any errors in grammar, word choice, or punctuation, but they are not as clear and concise as choice **b**.
